Improve student achievement on end-of-year assessments by 1% as measured by the USBE Report card through the continuation and improvement of the coaching and mentoring programs, and

the reduction of class sizes. We will also improve our counselor/student ratio to be closer to the state recommendation. Class size reductions will occur throughout the year, and all coaches and mentors will meet with teachers new to the building or the profession within the first semester. They will also offer professional development to all teachers, and work with teachers on a voluntary basis, as well as by recommendation from administration based on performance data.

Measurements

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Success will be measured by a growth of at least 1% on the school USBE report card. We were at 65.5% for the 2021-22 school year, and hope to see at least a score of 66.5%. This includes academic performance, growth, multi-language learner progress, and growth of the lowest 25%. We will also specifically target growth in math specifically through the coaching and mentoring programs, as well as class size reductions. Math achievement scores and growth scores should show at least a 1% growth. For achievement that means growing from 53.3% to 54.3%, and for growth going from 64.7% to 65.7%.

Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

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1. Student achievement will be improved through improved instruction facilitated by coaches, who will conduct coaching cycles with all teachers new to the building and new to the

profession (1-2 years) within the 1st semester.

- 2. Student achievement will be improved through improved instruction facilitated by coaches, who will meet with all teachers in the 1st quarter to review data and set meaningful goals. They will also check in throughout the year to analyze goal data and revise goals as needed with teachers.
- 3. We will improve student achievement in classes where teachers are new to the profession. To do this, our lead mentor will use the allotted daily time to plan professional development for and meet with mentors and mentees. Topics will include classroom management, goalsetting, collaboration practices, and self-reflection.
- 4. To improve the wellbeing (and thus achievement) of our students, an additional part-time counselor will be funded in order to provide wrap-around supports both academically and emotionally.
- 5. Student achievement will be targeted through class size reductions. Class sizes in all content areas will be reduced where possible in order to improve ratios. Math specifically will be targeted in order to offer extra support such as a math lab or help during lunch if budgets allow.
