ORCHESTRA LAB - One day each week to receive extra help and/or play in small ensembles. (TBA)

**Missed Performances:** Performances are 100% required. In the event of emergency or illness, a student may need complete specific assignments and friends-and-family performances to make up some of those points. For more information, see <u>music performance course addendum</u>.

**Instrument-Specific Information: Violinists and Violists** typically use their own instrument or rent from an outside source. I have a limited number of playable school-owned Violins & Violas to rent. **Cellists and Bassists** typically use two instruments, one rented for home use and the other rented for school use.

School-owned Instrument Rental Fees (Payable in person in the Main Office, or ONLINE in "Family Access" on Skyward). School instrument rental fees: \$80.00 (school year), \$40.00 (summer). Students must present receipts before their school-owned instrument is issued. Students may either print a receipt from Family Access or have our amazing Main Office personnel print you your receipt at the time of payment.

**Shoulder Rests:** All Violinists/Violists must use shoulder rests. Foam/Sponges are not allowed. Common shoulder rest brands I recommend are: *Everest and Christino*. NOTE: I do not recommend Kun shoulder rests because the feet break easily.

**Rosin**: Students supply their own rosin.

**Strings:** On privately owned instruments, students provide their own strings. All Violin, Viola, and Cello players need an extra set of strings for emergency breakages. On School-owned rented instruments, I will supply and personally install broken strings. I would recommend the *Dominant* brand of strings, but others will work.

**Books:** Orchestra I students purchase one method book: "Essential Elements 2000 for Strings" (Approximately \$10.00 per book).

Fines: Students are fined for lost or damaged school property, e.g. instruments, equipment and sheet music)

#### **Performance Attire:**

Orchestra 3: Orchestra T-shirts for less formal performances; Concert Black for Formal Performances:

- Ladies: Black dress or black shirt and pants. Shined black shoes. Black socks or tights.
- <u>Gentlemen</u>: A black suit, black or white collared shirt, and black tie. Black socks. <u>No athleisure, logos, rips, etc.</u>
- Orchestras 1 & 2: Best dress (formal/semi-formal). Orchestras I and II wear "best dress", but not formal. A variety of colors are fine. No athleisure, logos, rips, casual sneakers, etc.
